ELIGIBILITY	Enrolled in your home institution for more than one year. This is a program for non-Taiwanese citizens. If you have dual citizenship, please provide a copy of your non-Taiwanese passport. According to the Conscription Law, male students of conscription age who have a registered household here in Taiwan should enter Taiwan with their Taiwanese Passport.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES	<ol> <li>Students undergo an initial selection at their home institutions.</li> </ol>	
	<ol> <li>Nomination emails must be sent to NTU Law. The nominees have to upload the supporting documents to the provided application link before the designated deadline. NTU Law will review all the nominees' application documents.</li> </ol>	
	3. For <u>PRC passport holders</u> , we will contact them for applying Exit and Entry Permit, which usually takes 1 to 1.5 months to secure. The Permit will be sent via email.	
	And students who are <u>not PRC passport holders</u> need to contact the nearest Taiwan embassy/consulate for visa application.	
	<ol> <li>The official Letter of Admission and Letter of Approval will be sent out via email, whereas the original copies will be sent out only by request.</li> </ol>	
	5. Students have to take a health exam within 3 months before arrival.	
	<ol> <li>Students need to complete their Proposed Course Lists and be signed by the exchange office coordinators at their home institutions.</li> </ol>

TRANSCRIPT

Exchange students are required to take at least 4 credits (or 2 courses) each semester.

Written exams, take-home exams, projects, reports, presentations, group reports or essays. Final exams are given during the examination-week period (usually in January and June).

You will be graded on your performance in all of your enrolled courses. You and your home university shall expect to receive the electronic transcript in early-March (Fall Semester) or mid-September (Spring Semester).

## **GRADING SYSTEM**

#### **VISA INFORMATION**

Once admitted, you will receive the official <u>Letter of Admission</u> and <u>Letter of Approval</u> from NTU Law. You have to apply for a Visitor or Resident visa with these two letters before entering Taiwan. For more information on visa application procedures, please contact the nearest R.O.C. #### INSURANCE

Exchange students must provide a proof of accident insurance and medical insurance, both worth a minimum of TWD 1,000,000. The insurance must cover the entire exchange period. <u>Please purchase</u> <u>insurance in your home country</u>. In addition, according to Taiwan's Ministry of Education, exchange/visiting students are not entitled to the local student insurance plan unless they resident more than six months.

## **HEALTH EXAM**

To meet the requirements from NTU and the government, all new students must take a health exam by a qualified hospital and complete each examination listed on the <u>NTU health exam form and Form C</u>. If your exchange period is <u>more than six months</u> and you are going to apply for ARC, please conduct <u>Health</u> <u>Certificate for Residence Application</u> instead of Form C. You can take the health exam outside of Taiwan, as long as the exam includes all the required items, and is signed by the doctor as well as stamped by the hospital or clinic. And please note that you must take the exam within 3 months before arrival.

# ACCOMMODATION

Exchange students may apply for NTU Student Dormitory, which costs between TWD 4,840-10,100 per month, depending on different room types. However, **since the room number is limited, the arrangement will be decided by lots-drawing process.** The result will come out in around early-August (Fall semester) and early-December (Spring semester), and **only those who got the dormitory will receive the outcome and the check-in information via email.**

## **COURSE ENROLLMENT**

- 1. The course lists are usually available in early-August (Fall semester) and early-January (Spring semester), and the online course selection takes place 2 to 3 weeks prior to the beginning of semester.
- 2. Students could make a preliminary plan based on previous courses offered and should adjust the plan when the latest course list is available. For questions regarding a specific field/course, please contact the relevant department or the course instructor directly.
- 3. The first two weeks of classes are crucial for students as this is the course add/drop period when students can make final changes to their course schedule.

# Checklist for <u>Registration</u>

 A health exam form (The exam must be conducted within 3 months before your arrival.)
 A Proposed Course List, which shall be signed by your advisor or the international office at your home institution.
